You may know Chris from Bulletproof Shrink Wrapping which is his primary business. Shrink wrapping is commonly used on boats to protect them from the winter elements by tightly sealing them in plastic. "But any object can be shrinked wrapped," says Chris. Last winter he wrapped over 500 boats.

No new-comer to the area, North Idaho is in his blood. In the early 80's, Chris' Grandparents on his dad's side traveled here from Florida and bought the iconic Pastime Club in Athol.
