PEND OREILLE CITY INVESTIGATIONS

The Kootenai County Historic Preservation Commission obtained a Certified Local Government grant for archaeological research at Pend Oreille City at Buttonhook Bay. On September 26 and 27, University of Idaho Professor Dr. Tracy Camp and archaeology students conducted a field survey which included inventory, mapping and photo documentation. This was the first phase of investigation which will result in recommendation for nomination to the National Register of Historic Places.

During survey and mapping, the team correlated GPS with historic maps and identified features and artifacts which were associated with the 1860s settlement and steamboat landing period and later use of the site. The U of I will also conduct LiDAR mapping which utilizes remote sensing lasar technology to create high definition aerial photos showing features hidden by vegetation which are indistinguishable on the ground. Survey and recording have shown that there is potential to discover more features and artifacts at the site. With National Register designation, the site can be managed to protect it from further destruction and ensure future interpretive opportunities.

A second grant will fund 2016 U of I investigations which will include ground penetrating radar mapping, artifact analysis and preparation of documents for the National Register nomination.



Brrrrrr ... It's 33° outside!

Here's some storage tips, <u>before</u> freezing temps hit equipment that is stored:

Change the engine oil and filter, both <u>before</u> and <u>after</u> storage.

Be sure motors are protected to -30* with antifreeze. Use -30* *RV type* anti freeze in camper sinks, toilets, water lines, boat motors and jet skis

Gas can go bad in just 30 days. Add fuel stabilizer and top off gas tanks.

Use "fogging oil" in engine cylinders. Grease or lube bearings, pivots and linkages. Install a new air filter. Check tire pressures, then block tires off the ground. Protect tires from sunlight.

Remove battery, check water, clean terminals. Store inside, off the floor, in a warm area, <u>away from flame sources</u>. Keep charged up with a "*Battery Tender*" type charger.

Clean and wax equipment, WD40 works on metal or rubber parts.

Remember: An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure.

Winterize all lawn, garden equipment and vehicles now....before it freezes!
