On Sunday, the 18th of September, it finally did go right. There were eleven boats in the race and ten of them finished within a six minute time span.

Property Tax Reduction Program

The property tax reduction program (Circuit Breaker) reduces your home or mobile home taxes if you qualify. If your income is \$29,470 or less a year you might want to contact the Kootenai County Assessor.

As of January 1, 2016 you qualify if you are 65 and older, a widow(er), or are disabled as recognized by Social Security or Federal Civil Service. There's an application to complete and you must provide proof of income, medical expenses, ownership of property, and the requirement you meet (age 65, disabled, blind, etc.).

Airport Shuttle Available

What if you need a ride to the airport, have a departing flight at 6 am and don't want to ask anyone to take you? It's a big favor to ask anyone to drive you to the airport especially with a 4 am wake up. This can be a problem for any of us.

A Coeur d'Alene business, Payless Airport Shuttle, will pick you up at your door and drive you to the airport or anywhere else. You will need to make a reservation at least one day in advance. Owner, Jeff Hall, has been in business 18 years, has five employees and three minivans. Rides to the airport cost \$80.00 for one to two people and he doesn't take credit cards, only checks or cash.

It might sound steep but if you consider it's almost a three hour round trip, the cost of gas and the convenience, then it might just be worth it. It's always good to know



that there's another choice out there in case your stuck with no way to get to or from the airport. For Payless Shuttle call 208-762-7433.
