ABC FOOD BANK - It Takes A Village

Well, actually it takes a couple of villages, several civic organizations and a lot of thoughtful local businesses & citizens.

Charlotte Hooper, Director of the ABC Food Bank in Athol is one very special lady. She, with the help of Chief Stocker David Harms, Driver Gary Devine, and a dedicated group of other volunteers are the people that keep this vital organization going. Last month alone, the Food Bank helped nearly 600 people, 200 of whom were senior citizens. That's a lot of help!

According to Charlotte, the most needed donations include food such as canned soups, canned tuna or chicken, canned fruit, peanut butter, as well as personal supplies like shampoo and conditioner, toothpaste and toothbrushes, razors and shave cream.

The Food Bank also receives cash donations, and there are other organizations like Little Town Market and 2nd Harvest that help "stretch" those gifts. She said that organizations like 2nd Harvest are subsidized but there are cash costs involved in administration.

Charlotte said that both cash and food donations are deeply appreciated and both will be well used. In addition to donations of food and supplies, the cash outlays to keep the food bank running last year were roughly \$1200 per month.

Other contributors that help keep the ABC Food Bank running include Costco as well as civic organizations in Athol and Bayview that hold fund raisers or food drives. And, of course, many individuals community members make vital contributions to the food bank's survival and success.

Finally, with the holidays coming up, Charlotte wanted to thank the Timberlake Fire Protection District and Scenic Bay Marinas & the Karupiah Family for their previous donations of Turkeys for Thanksgiving. In addition, the food bank hands out holiday boxes with festive fare so any contributions of canned fruit or cranberry sauce, for instance, would be especially welcomed.

So, from Charlotte to our generous community, a big "Thank You!" And from us to you, Charlotte, a very grateful and heartfelt, "Thank YOU and well done!"
