"Eighteen years ago I stopped at the top of the Cape Horn Road and I knew I wanted to live here for the rest of my life," reminisces **Bruce Reynolds.**

It's been said that art should be something that liberates your soul. At

Bruce's home on the Cape, he finds his inspiration from Lake Pend Oreille vistas

With over 450 pieces of art for sale, Bruce is nothing if not prolific . "My cabinets, doors, and fan blades are all custom painted. Some paintings are not only visual in daylight, but look brilliant under the bright light, black lights and fluorescent/glow in the dark. Some paintings have all these features in one canvas" says Bruce.

Bruce likes to create in series and says, "Some of my series include the Coffee Cup Series, Outer Space Series, Geometrical Series, and Spin Series. My latest series is the Cross Series.

According to Bruce he has never taken classes and creates from his own imagination. "Ten years ago, I began my own journey, creating and always progressing. I uniquely distribute the paint on the canvas, shooting off the wheel of my motorcycle and my radio controlled car. I've thrown paint from the top of a ladder and shot paint onto a canvas with an air compressor. I've also shot paint off a dismantled fan and swung from the rafters of my studio on a swing with a paint belt wrapped around my body with multiple colors."

Integrated into his art is also driftwood. **Driftwood Moguls** is his business name. Along with his manager,
Reen Howard, they harvest massive root balls from
public Idaho beaches with two trucks, a 10 x 20 trailer
and winch. Art knows no boundaries for this creative
team: a 71-year-old woman and a 56-year-old man.

"I design and create both small and massive glass top driftwood tables, large pieces of yard art, mailboxes and signs, etc." The driftwood is harvested wet and has to dry for six months in warm weather before processing.

Some pieces are brilliantly colored using an ancient kilning technique. Yard art is washed numerous times to bring out the clarity of the wood and coated with five coats of exterior polyurethane. It can also be purchased natural.
