It's said "Small business isn't for the faint of heart. It's for the brave, the patient and the persistent. It's for the overcomer." It's been a year since Shore Lines featured an article about **Grease Monkey**. At that time owner, **Chris Watts** had visions of opening his 16 point oil change and routine maintenance for vehicles plus UTV and boat services franchise in a few months. That never happened.

According to Chris, "It took them 14 months to close my loan; it was supposed to take three to five months. Then we hit Covid which caused supply chain issues. For example, we waited over 6 months for concrete for the slab. Afterwards, an out-of-state subcontractor really hurt me; he didn't quote for a North Idaho snow load and when he got here with the steel studs he increased the cost by \$100,000.00. Finally we just finished the winter that would never end, snow on the ground from late October to early April delayed pouring the concrete curbing and sidewalks which delayed asphalt which delayed the car wash install." All this added up makes four years into an eighteen month project.

Chris is now looking at a very solid "soft open" hopefully in June. The 2022 original manager has moved on and Chris has since hired Niki Clements as the 2023 Manager. Niki has a solid background with experience that will lend itself nicely to the running of the franchise. The shop crew has been hired. They are just in a bit of a holding pattern as they get ready to open but will be brought on for specific training in another couple of weeks.

The car wash has four options from a basic to a premier wash; each with additional products, features and benefits. They will be \$8, \$10, \$12, and \$14 respectively.

Grease Monkey will be open 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday thru Friday which is a little later than originally planned to accommodate after work clients. Saturday 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and closed on Sunday. The car wash will be open 24/7 for everyone's convenience.

Chris wants folks to know that he has registered to sponsor a fall soccer team and a summer baseball team, Teams haven't been assigned yet, but he's looking forward to those. And he's super excited to finally be able to provide these services to our community.
